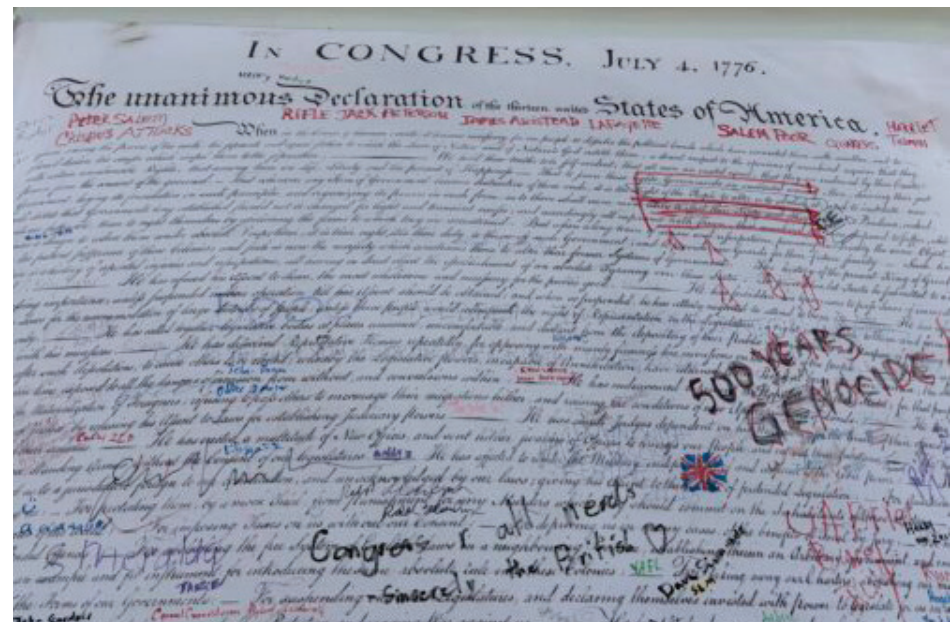


Defacing a Declaration of Independence Signed by Your Fellow Americans?

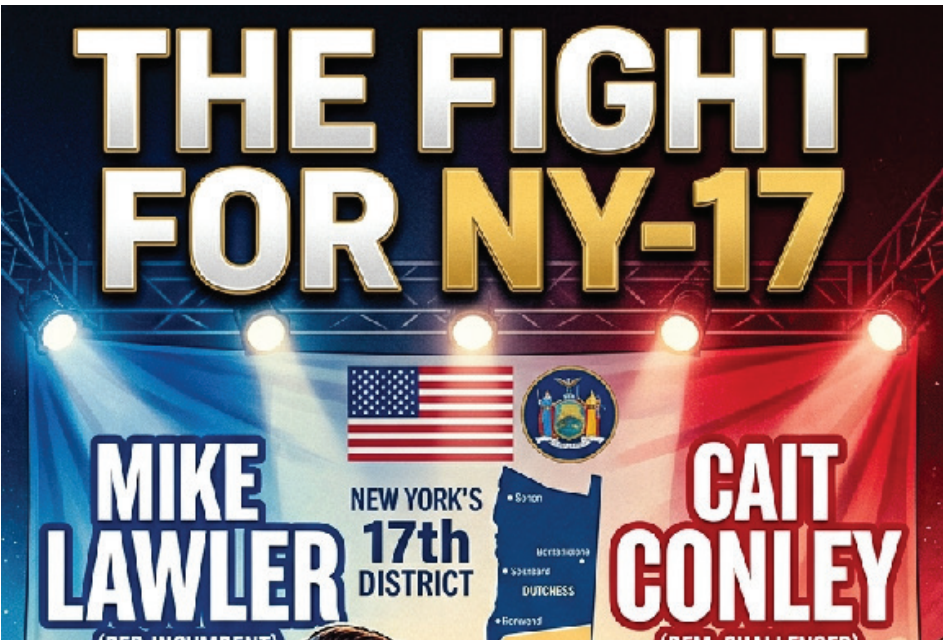

The US Attorney's Office for the SDNY asked for a sentence of more than four years.

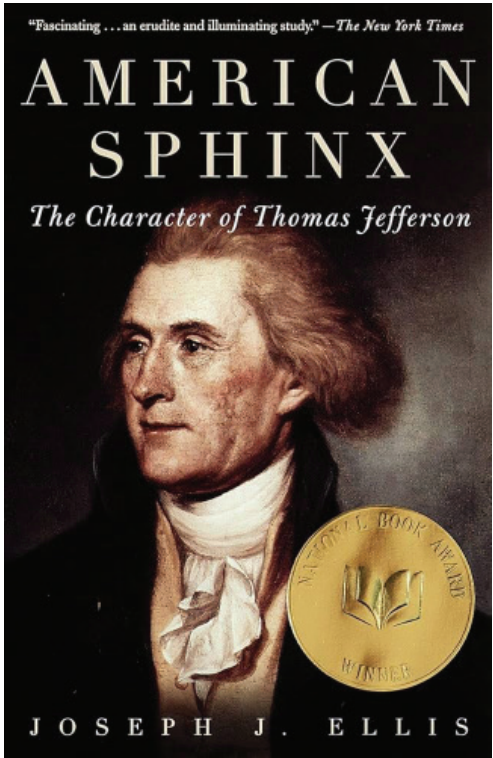

Borrowers on SAVE Plan Will Receive Notices About Finding a New Federal Payment Plan Within 90 Days

New York Attorney General Letitia James today issued a consumer alert urging New Yorkers with federal student loans to prepare for the upcoming termination of the Saving on a Valuable Education (SAVE) plan. On July 1, 2026, borrowers who are enrolled in the SAVE plan began receiving notifications from their student loan servicer about choosing a different repayment plan. All those currently enrolled in the SAVE plan who do not choose a new repayment plan within 90 days of receiving a notification will likely be automatically moved to the Standard Plan, which does not consider income and often requires higher monthly payments than other plans. Attorney General James encourages all New Yorkers on the SAVE plan to consider their options and choose the repayment plan that makes the most financial sense for them.

“As federal cuts change student loan programs across the country, my office is here to ensure New Yorkers have all the facts about their loan options,” said Attorney General James. “Student loans are already a heavy burden, and no New Yorker should find themselves in an expensive repayment plan they didn’t choose. New Yorkers enrolled in SAVE plans should start searching for an alternative repayment plan to get ahead of this transition.”

The SAVE plan is an income-driven repayment plan implemented in 2023 that was designed to be one of the most affordable options available. In 2024, a federal court ordered the U.S. Department of Education (ED) to place all borrowers enrolled in SAVE into a mandatory forbearance and eventually terminate the SAVE Plan. The Trump administration announced its measures to end the SAVE plan in December 2025. Starting July 1, 2026, loan servicers began notifying each borrower of the date their SAVE forbearance will end. After a borrower receives this notice, they will have 90 days to select a new repayment plan before being automatically enrolled in another plan, most likely the Standard Plan. The Standard Plan does not take the borrower’s income level into account, meaning that monthly payments under the Standard Plan are often higher than under other loan repayment plans.

Borrowers whose most recent loan was disbursed or consolidated before July 1, 2026 might have the following options depending on their circumstances:

- Income-Based Repayment (IBR);
- Pay as You Earn (PAYE);
- Income-Contingent Repayment (ICR);

The Repayment Assistance Plan (RAP), which became available on July 1, 2026; or

Traditional repayment plans, including Standard, Graduated, and Extended plans.

While returning borrowers have access to PAYE and ICR plans for now, all borrowers on these plans will have to pick new plans by July 1, 2028.

Borrowers whose most recent loan will be disbursed or consolidated on or after July 1, 2026, will have to choose between the Repayment Assistance Plan (RAP), which became available on July 1, 2026, and the Standard Plan.

Creepy Somers Guy Arrested for Stalking a 74-Year Old
Woman Walking in North Salem

On June 1, 2026, New York State Police in Somers arrested Michael P. Danko, 46, of Somers, New York, following an investigation into an incident involving a female pedestrian in the Town of North Salem.

The investigation began after a witness contacted 911 regarding an encounter on Mills Road. The victim, a 74-year-old female, reported the incident was part of unwanted contact that had occurred over several months. She reported that Danko repeatedly approached her while she was walking and made inappropriate comments that caused her to fear for her safety.

Following the investigation and consultation with the Westchester County District Attorney’s Office, Danko was charged with:

- Stalking in the Fourth Degree, a class B misdemeanor
- Harassment in the First Degree, a class B misdemeanor

Danko was arraigned in the Town of North Salem Justice Court, where a full stay-away Order of Protection was issued on behalf of the victim. He is scheduled to return to court on June 15, 2026, at 5:30 p.m.

Lawler and Latimer Agree on One Thing:
Support for Israel

Though bipartisan agreement is in short supply these days, Rep. Mike Lawler – a 39-year-old Republican representing New York’s 17th congressional district – and George Latimer – a Democrat representing New York’s 16th congressional district – share at least one thing in common: support for Israel.

In 2024, a year after he first took office, Lawler introduced the Stand with Israel Act, which would have required the withholding of U.S. funding to United Nations agencies that expel, downgrade, suspend, or otherwise restrict the participation of the State of Israel. The bill, which didn’t get out of committee, was modeled after the current prohibition of funding to any UN entities that elevate the status of the Palestinian Authority to a member state.

In April of this year, Lawler and Rep. Josh Gottheimer introduced a bipartisan resolution condemning the rise of what they call antisemitic, hate-filled rhetoric disseminated by prominent online personalities including Hasan Piker and Candace Owens.

“Piker has openly applauded Hamas’ terrorism, downplayed the mass rape of civilians on Oct. 7, and dehumanized Orthodox Jews as ‘inbred,’ Lawler said in a press release. “Owens has trafficked in vile conspiracy theories, promoted blood libels, and platformed Holocaust deniers. With an audience of millions, they have a responsibility to confront hatred and bigotry in every form, not to amplify it to the masses.”

As for Latimer, the former county executive was elected in 2024 after defeating incumbent Democrat Rep. Jamaal Bowman in the most expensive congressional primary in history. Westchester’s former county executive had the backing of pro-Israel groups against Bowman, who has been a vocal critic of Israel.

On Oct. 7, 2025, the two-year anniversary of Hamas’ attack on Israel, Latimer made his position clear.

“Two years ago today, Hamas launched a brutal attack on Israel—murdering 1,200 innocent people and taking more than 250 hostages,” he said in a statement. “As we remember the lives lost, we stand in solidarity with their families whose pain endures. The remaining hostages must be released immediately. Their families have waited far too long. Hamas must accept the ceasefire proposal, end this war, and stop the suffering. Enough is enough.”

Months earlier, Latimer joined other lawmakers on a visit to Israel with the American Israel Education Foundation.

“I’m appreciative to be here with colleagues and we still think for ourselves and try to come up with what will hopefully be the right public policies that will support Israel and freedom across the world and at the same time be sensitive to all of the different players here in the Middle East.”

Lawler and Latimer sit on the House Foreign Affairs Committee.

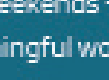

the first media outlets to report on Singh’s crimes in an April 2023 story titled, Underage Sex Sting in NJ Nabs Anand Singh, Westchester BOL Staffer .

A YouTube channel named OBL Global caught a former democratic staffer at the Westchester County Board of Legislators, Anand Singh, in an undercover, underage, sex sting in New Jersey.

The incident was posted on YouTube April 11, but the incident occurred in Mid-December of 2022.

The video is graphic in content, and in the comments and messages by Anand Singh, who thought that he was chatting with a 14-year old girl.

Singh asks for the two to meet on Snapchat, to exchange photos and videos. “I want to share something with you. I’m doing something and I want you to watch.”

Shortly after this message exchange, Singh backs off, messaging, “Save my number and in a few years hit me up,” and “I am into it but I have to be the adult in this situation.”

But shortly after Singh returns to graphic messages, including questions about the 14-year olds sexual history, and the type of sex he hopes to have with her. “are you on birth control–I could def hold you down lol.”

Some of the chat messages have the name Hidley Anand, perhaps his Giglio name.

Then the conversation turns to inviting another underage girl to join them. “Do any of your friends like older guys too? Maybe we can all get together and party.”

Anand then makes the decision to meet this young girl at 1am that evening. He traveled 2.5 hours, and during the drive made 5 phone calls to the young girl decoy. The audio of these calls is in the YouTube video and graphic.

Arriving at 1am at the designated location in Newark, Anand is confronted by Ramy and OBL. He then gets back into his car and leaves.

Two police officers show up and are filmed speaking with Ramy, the creator of OBL Global. The incident occurred in Newark and the Newark Police Department responded to the 911 call but arrived after Singh had left.

The FBI later arrested Singh in NY.

We spoke to Ramy to verify this story, and he was shocked at the depravity of Singh’s messages and graphic sexual comments. “-I’ve caught over 300 of these guys, before millions of viewers, and this was one of the worst chat logs I have ever seen. There are more stuff and posts that I couldn’t post. And the fact that he was a government official is heartbreaking. He violated our trust, and even the decoy, who is in her 20’s was traumatized at what he was saying.

Singh worked for former Yonkers City Council President Mike Khader, from 2019-2021. And until his termination, Singh worked for the Westchester County Board of Legislators, on the staff of both the Legislation and Economic Development committees.

Ramy said that Singh was wise to leave and not stick around and confess what he did. “He committed felonies and by showing up he can be charged with child endangerment. He crossed state lines to have sex with a minor. And the duffle bag he showed up with was filled with sex toys. But he didn’t stay around and incriminate himself.”

According to Ramy, he posted the video of Singh sometime in mid-December, but then took it down after the livestream. Many people watching the livestream recognized Singh and started notifying officials in Westchester four months ago.

Ramy said that County Legislator Colin Smith reached out to OBL for more information, and explained that after the livestream in December, their YouTube channel was taken down, and he had to create another channel. OBL was also involved in two other high-profile cases, and the Singh incident got pushed back. End of our 2023 story.

Singh’s boss, County Legislator Chair Catherine Borgia, was made aware of the allegations in December and referred them to the County Public Safety Department but took no further action. Borgia political career was derailed when she was forced to resign as board chair the next month because she failed to consult with county legislators and did not protect board members and staff.

The story includes, “ A former aide to the Westchester Board of Legislators who was caught by a vigilante group trying to meet a 14-year-old girl for sex has been sentenced to two years in federal prison.”

We do not agree with the characterization of OBL and Ramy as a Vigilante Group. We see them as a vital group of concerned citizens who are trying to find sexual predators and hand the information they found over to police.

Former NBC reporter Chris Hansen provides a similar show, and resource, to the public.

We have subscribed to OBL’s channel, to support their work, and we encourage our readers to do the same.

tempt to avoid a blackout.
On July 2–3, 2026, the Westchester County Yonkers Joint Sewage Treatment Plant suffered a major power breakdown that resulted in the discharge of 39 million gallons of chlorinated, partially treated sewage into the Hudson River.
The incident unfolded over the busy Independence Day holiday weekend due to a mix of extreme weather and equipment failure:

The Cause: During a severe regional heatwave, Con Edison initiated emergency power reductions. The massive reduction in voltage placed an intense, unexpected strain on the treatment facility’s equipment. While the plant’s backup generators initially kicked on as designed, the compounding mechanical stress caused the backup system to fail, leading to a complete power outage at the facility.

On July 2, Con Edison stated, “Con Edison is asking customers in certain areas of Yonkers, Pelham, Mount Vernon, Bronxville, Eastchester, New Rochelle and the town of Mamaroneck in Westchester, and in certain areas of the Northeast Bronx and City Island, to conserve energy while crews repair equipment. Con Edison has reduced voltage in the area by 8 percent to protect equipment and maintain service as crews make repairs.

“The Westchester area is roughly bounded by the Bronx on the south, parts of Eastchester and New Rochelle on the north, parts of Yonkers and Tuckahoe on the east, and parts of New Rochelle and Mamaroneck on the west. The affected area also includes some customers in the northeast part of the Bronx and on City Island. The total customer count is 89,000.”

The Spill: The power failure began on the night of Thursday, July 2, and paralyzed the main processing systems. Operators bypassed standard treatments to avoid a catastrophic internal backup, leading to the 39-million-gallon discharge. The plant was not fully operational again until 1:45 p.m. on Friday, July 3.

The Impact & Health Advisories: The Westchester County Department of Health immediately issued an emergency advisory warning residents to avoid all direct, recreational contact with the Hudson River—including swimming, kayaking, paddleboarding, boating, and fishing.

Affected Areas: The water quality advisory stretched from the New York City line north through several Westchester riverfront communities, including Yonkers, Hastings-on-Hudson, Dobbs Ferry, Irvington, Tarrytown, Sleepy Hollow, and Briarcliff Manor. The Philipse Manor Beach Club in Sleepy Hollow was also ordered closed. While the plant quickly returned to full operations on July 3, county health officials kept the recreational river advisories in place well into the following week to allow residual contamination to clear and water quality testing to return to baseline safety levels.

Con Edison maintains that power flow in Yonkers continued for July 2 and 3, and that the 8% voltage reduction would not have completely shut down the plant.

Initially, County Executive Ken Jenkins office stated in a release that the failure was “due to the power reductions by Con Edison from the extreme heat.”

That comment was later corrected to include power issues” as a possible cause.

The New York Times covered the story (<https://www.nytimes.com/2026/07/03/nyregion/sewage-spill-hudson-river.html>)Internal

and included, “According to a state report released Friday night, the Yonkers plant lost power because of extreme heat and humidity and could not transfer power over to its generators.” We have not been able to identify or obtain that report.

But neither the NY Times nor the Journal News, which also covered the event, did not identify the actual cause of the massive spill or who is to blame. Residents in Southwest Yonkers who live near the plant DO WANT ANSWERS, and others have called for an investigation.

Some posts on social media include former employees at the plant and those with knowledge of the backup generators, which appear to have failed at a critical point.

One post wrote, “I just retired from there out of fear that someone would get hurt and that I would be held responsible for something beyond my control. New York State should witness actual full load generator testing as they always have instead of simply saying, “Do it yourself and let us know when you’re done.”

Another post wrote, “I was the Superintendent of Maintenance at the plant. A few years back, the plant had a major generator failure that would have been prevented if the Deputy Commissioner had acted on the concerns I raised. Instead, my concerns were ignored, and the plant went down for an extended period.

The DEC investigated the previous incident, and the facts were twisted or misrepresented. As a result of that incident, another engineering study was ordered. An engineering firm was hired to evaluate the emergency generator and determine what equipment could safely be operated on generator power.

I was told that the State, along with the engineering firm, would conduct a full load test of the emergency generator. I welcomed the test because I wanted to see whether the recommended equipment list would actually perform as expected while operating on generator power.

I kept asking when the load test would be scheduled. I was repeatedly told that the State had not provided a date. I continued to ask, but my questions were ignored. To my knowledge, the load test was never conducted.”

The residents of Southwest Yonkers deserve answers, and so do the thousands of Westchester residents who use the Hudson River for recreation every day.

Last Tuesday, three New York City socialists won their Congressional primaries: Brad Lander in NY-10, Claire Valdez in NY-7, and Darializa Avila Chevalier in NY-13. The very next day, Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez stated that she was looking forward to working with Cait Conley and her fellow socialists. Brad Lander said he was excited to campaign for Cait Conley in the Hudson Valley after winning in NY-10.

And Cait Conley’s response? “I welcome anyone here in this district.”

So, who exactly is Cait Conley welcoming into the Hudson Valley?

Brad Lander (NY-10). In June 2020, Lander published an open letter with a title that says it all: “My commitment to working to defund the NYPD.” He called for cutting a billion dollars from the police budget. Recently, Brad stated he was looking forward to campaigning for Cait Conley in the Hudson Valley.

Claire Valdez (NY-7). Valdez calls herself a “proud democratic socialist,” and her own campaign website pledges that she will “fight to dismantle and abolish ICE.” She was arrested inside Senator Chuck Schumer’s Manhattan office in August 2025 while protesting U.S. arms sales to Israel. At a televised primary debate, she said Israel had committed “genocide” and said she would support arresting Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on an International Criminal Court warrant if he set foot in New York.

Darializa Avila Chevalier (NY-13). Deleted tweets reviewed by CNN’s KFile show her calling to abolish the police, prisons, and borders, declaring “all deportation is wrong,” and reposting a message that “Israel doesn’t exist.” She also called President Biden a “rapist.” Darializa even attended the pro-Hamas Times Square rally on October 8, 2023, the day after October 7th, an event so widely condemned that fellow primary winner Brad Lander quit the DSA over the party’s promotion of it. At a March 2026 candidate forum, she declined to condemn Hamas’s October 7 attack when asked directly. She also co-founded Columbia University Apartheid Divest (CUAD), the campus group that later posted that it was fighting for the “total eradication of Western civilization.”

And Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (NY-14) herself, who has called to “Abolish ICE,” still champions defunding the police on her campaign website and pledged at a March 2026 NYC-DSA forum to vote against any U.S. military aid to Israel, including defensive systems such as the Iron Dome, which she has previously voted against.

Less than 24 hours after the polls closed, Rep. Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez took to X to congratulate Cait Conley by name, declaring that she looked forward to “working together as a delegation as we fight for working families across New York.” The question for Cait Conley is simple: Does she accept her place by AOC’s

Cait Conley won her primary while refusing to tell voters what two Palantir-linked AI defense contractors paid her nearly \$335,000 to do, citing nondisclosure agreements. Now that she’s the nominee, the Lawler for Congress campaign is calling on Conley to release certified copies of her NDAs with Primer AI and Hidden Level. If she won’t, voters deserve to know why.

Cait Conley is now the Democratic nominee for New York’s 17th Congressional District. She earned that nomination without ever answering a basic question: What are Primer AI and Hidden Level paying her hundreds of thousands of dollars to do?

Conley’s own financial disclosure, filed only after a local reporter and constituents pressed her, shows roughly \$335,000 in income from the two firms, \$35,000 from Primer, and nearly \$300,000 from Hidden Level. Both companies work alongside Palantir, the contractor helping the federal government carry out its surveillance and deportation operations. Primer advertises that it supports DHS “homeland security operations.” Primer also won what was then its largest federal contract in history, a multi-million-dollar deal with US Special Operations Command, in October 2020, while Conley was serving as Director of Operations at Army Special Operations Command, inside SOCOM.

When voters and members of the media asked what she actually did for that money, Conley said she had signed nondisclosure agreements and could not discuss it. Lawler for Congress campaign manager **Ciro Riccardi** today called on her to release certified copies of those agreements:

“Cait Conley is asking Hudson Valley voters to make her their voice in Congress, but she’s doing so while hiding who has been signing her checks and what they bought. She says an NDA ties her hands. Fine. Then release certified copies of them. If there is nothing in Cait Conley’s arrangement with Primer and Hidden Level that voters would object to, a certified copy of each NDA costs her nothing. So, which is it, Cait? Or will you ask them to trust you while you keep them in the dark? If you are serious about representing the Hudson Valley, you’ll release them. If you won’t, voters deserve to know why.”

The Lawler campaign is working hard to identify Conley at too far left, and out of touch for the voters in NY-17. The campaign tactic that the Lawler campaign, and look for the Conley campaign to use, is two-fold.
