Putnam County Sheriff Brian Hess sent out the following release on June 12.

CONNECTICUT MAN ARRESTED FOLLOWING PUBLIC LEWDNESS INCIDENT IN PUTNAM LAKE

Sheriff Brian Hess announces the arrest of Craig A. Kropka, 39, of New Fairfield, Connecticut, following an investigation into a public lewdness complaint in the Putnam Lake area of the Town of Patterson.

On June 10, 2026, members of the Putnam County Sheriff’s Office responded to the Putnam Lake area after a resident reported that while walking

her dogs on Lakeshore Drive, a male operating a gray SUV pulled alongside her and allegedly exposed himself while making vulgar remarks.

During the investigation, deputies obtained a witness statement and reviewed video surveillance footage from the area. Through investigative efforts conducted by Patrol and the Bureau of Criminal Investigation, Craig A. Kropka was

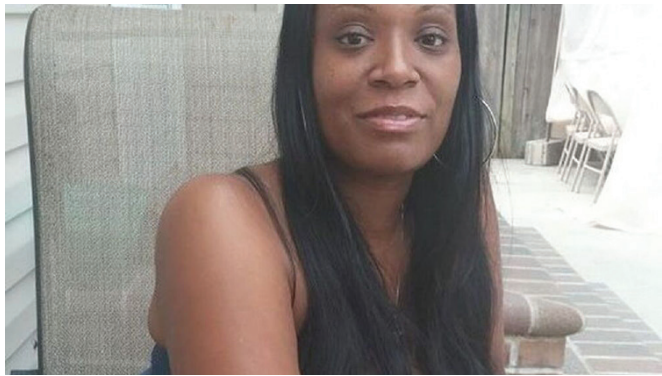

New York City Correction's Captain from Yonkers Indicted for Extortion and Wage Fraud Scheme

Defendant Allegedly Extorted Subordinates for Money, a Louis Vuitton Handbag, and Personal Errands, and Defrauded The City of Thousands of Dollars in Wages

An indictment was unsealed in Brooklyn charging Latanya Brown with extortion and federal program funds theft. Brown is a Captain with the New York City Department of Correction (DOC). The indictment charges Brown with two counts of extortion and one count of fraudulently obtaining funds from a federally funded government agency. Brown was arrested today and will be arraigned this afternoon before United States Magistrate Judge Seth D. Eichenholtz.

"As alleged, the defendant brazenly abused her authority as a law enforcement supervisor to steal taxpayer money and terrorize her subordinates by shaking them down for money, expensive gifts, and chauffeuring her to run personal errands, including trips to a casino while she was on duty," stated United States Attorney Nocella. "Our Office will vigorously prosecute corrupt government officials who betray the public's trust, and where applicable as in this case, seek forfeiture of ill-gotten funds."

As alleged in the indictment, Brown has been employed by the DOC since October 2001 and has held the rank of Captain since July 2007. Between approximately July 2024 and November 2025, Brown was assigned to Rikers Island's Facility Operations Department as a DOC supervisor. Between approximately November 2025 and December 2025, Brown was assigned to New York State courthouses located in the Bronx. As a Captain, Brown supervised other correction officers and was responsible for approving employee requests for shift-schedule changes, overtime shifts, and vacation time. In 2024 and 2025, Brown regularly threatened to withhold approvals for shift changes, overtime shifts, and vacation time requests for her officers unless they agreed to pay her money, buy luxury items for her, and/or perform personal errands for her. For example, in December 2024, Brown forced several officers to buy an expensive Louis Vuitton bag for her. When Brown made her demand, she made statements to the DOC officers implying, in sum and substance, that their shift assignments, overtime shifts, and vacation time would be in jeopardy unless they purchased the luxury item. Additionally, on numerous occasions, Brown forced officers to drive her while on duty for non-work-related purposes, such as visits to restaurants, bars, and a casino.

In 2024 and 2025, Brown received more than \$250,000 in regular pay and more than \$400,000 in overtime pay. However, on more than 100 occasions during this time period, Brown submitted documentation to the DOC claiming that she had worked the entirety of regular and overtime shifts, when in fact she actually arrived to work several hours late or left work several hours early on those occasions. On some occasions, when Brown left her assigned posting early, she did so to spend time at the Empire City Casino in Yonkers, New York. For example, on November 21, 2024, Brown claimed in documentation submitted to the DOC to have worked from 5:00 a.m. until 9:31 p.m. on Rikers Island. However, Brown was not at Rikers Island during the entirety of that shift and instead arrived at the casino that day at approximately 2:34 p.m. Nevertheless, Brown was compensated by the DOC as if she had worked her full shift and at least seven hours of overtime.

Westchester County Launches \$25 Million Housing Flex Fund for Affordable Housing

Application Period Opens June 17 for New Affordable Housing Financing Program

Westchester County Executive Ken Jenkins announced the launch of the County's Housing Flex Fund II, a new \$25 million affordable housing initiative designed to accelerate the development and creation of affordable homes across Westchester County. The application period opens on June 17 and will remain open through Aug. 21, inviting eligible developers to compete for funding to help advance affordable housing projects in communities throughout the County.

Housing Flex Fund II builds on the success of the County's existing housing programs by providing flexible financing for developments in need of the last bit of funding to begin construction of new rental and homeownership units, those with supportive housing units and developments that preserve affordability. The program is expected to significantly increase the County's annual affordable housing production while prioritizing developments in transit-oriented locations and areas with limited affordable housing options.

Westchester County Executive Ken Jenkins said: "Every family deserves access to a safe and affordable place to live. Housing Flex Fund II is another example of Westchester County's commitment to investing in solutions that create housing opportunities and support long-term economic growth. This program will help move important projects from the drawing board to construction, creating more affordable homes for current and future residents."

Westchester County Department of Planning Commissioner Blanca Lopez said: "Housing Flex Fund II provides developers with an important financing tool that will help close funding gaps and bring more affordable housing projects to completion. With our support of projects that are ready to move forward and located in communities with access to transportation, jobs and amenities, this program will have a lasting impact on housing availability throughout Westchester County."

Applicants must submit a complete funding package that includes a development proposal, project narrative, financial pro forma and project budget. Eligible rental developments must provide housing for households earning 65% of the Area Median Income or below, while affordable homeownership developments may serve households earning up to 80% of the Area Median Income for a minimum of 50 years. Applications serving those at the lowest incomes possible, including supportive housing units will receive additional priority. Applications will be reviewed after the application period closes, with funding awards expected to be approved later this year and disbursements beginning in 2027.

DA Cacace Charges Man, Arrested in Bronxville for Impersonating an NYPD Officer with a Gun



Westchester County District Attorney Susan Cacace announced today that a Manhattan man was arrested for allegedly impersonating a New York City Police Department officer, including allegations that he possessed a fake badge and a loaded gun.

Dylan J. Gonzalez, 26, was arraigned on a felony complaint Friday charging him with Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the Second Degree, a class C felony, and Criminal Impersonation in the First Degree, a class E felony.

Justice Natasha Nordahl set bail at \$10,000 cash/\$20,000 bond/\$40,000 partially secured bond. The defendant is due back in court today.

DA Cacace said: "All residents of this county expect that when they encounter

someone donning the insignia of law enforcement, that person has taken an oath to protect and serve, not to deflect and deceive. As alleged, this defendant impersonated a police officer, going so far as to be in possession of a fake badge and loaded pistol on the streets of Bronxville. We will now seek to ensure he is held accountable for these deceptions."

According to a felony complaint filed with the court, on June 12, 2026, at 9 Park Place in the Village of Bronxville, the defendant was found in possession of a loaded Glock 19 9mm semiautomatic pistol. The defendant also allegedly pretended to be a police officer by wearing an NYPD detective shield on his belt in the vicinity of the firearm.

When a Supervisory Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation inquired with the defendant whether he was "on the job," the defendant replied in the affirmative, according to the complaint.

When the FBI agent asked the defendant about his police identification card, he replied, in sum and substance, that the card "was at home," the complaint alleges.

The defendant does not possess a valid New York State pistol permit nor is he a licensed dealer in firearms.

An inventory search of his vehicle yielded two 15-round 9mm loaded magazines and two blue ballistic vests with gold NYPD Velcro shields on the left shoulder area and NYPD Police Warrant Squad Velcro patches on the center. One vest had a body camera holder affixed.

This case was investigated by the Westchester County Department of Public Safety. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Gregory Allen of the Mount Vernon Branch.

Radioactive Material Found in Port Chester Sanitation Truck



The Village of Port Chester has recently experienced an incident in which radiation detection equipment at a regional waste transfer facility identified radioactive material within a refuse collection vehicle servicing this area.

As part of standard safety protocols, when radioactive material is detected, the vehicle is detained at the facility until the material decays to acceptable levels. This process can take days or, in some cases, weeks. A single contaminated load can remove an entire sanitation truck from service, significantly impacting Village operations and reducing our ability to efficiently collect and manage refuse throughout the community.

The loss of a collection vehicle places considerable strain on sanitation services, including route delays, reduced collection efficiency, increased operational costs, and challenges in maintaining the level of service residents expect and deserve.

Residents are reminded that radioactive materials must never be disposed of in household garbage. In certain instances, individuals undergoing cancer treatment or nuclear medicine procedures may generate waste products that contain detectable levels of radioactivity. If you or someone in your household has recently undergone such treatment, please consult your healthcare provider regarding the proper handling and disposal of any related materials before placing them in the trash.

Your cooperation is essential to protecting sanitation workers, maintaining reliable refuse collection services, and preventing unnecessary disruptions to Village operations.

Thank you for your attention to this important matter and for helping us keep Port Chester safe, clean, and operating efficiently.

The Village of Port Chester is advising residents that one of its sanitation vehicles has been detained by Westchester County after traces of radiation contamination were registered during its drop off this morning.

In an effort to limit the number of additional trucks from being potentially impacted by such contamination tomorrow and so on, we are distributing this notice to homes located in the general vicinity of Shelley Avenue/ Robert Avenue/ Hawley Avenue this afternoon.

We ask that all village residents who may be under the care of a physician who prescribes treatments or medication regimens for them that utilize radiation or radioactive elements arrange for the disposal of all contaminated refuse to transpire privately and consult their physician for necessary guidance.

The Village of Port Chester cannot collect radioactive material.

Anthony Merante, the Republican candidate for New York State Senate, District 35, is calling for stronger local authority to regulate public marijuana consumption, citing growing concerns from residents about quality of life, public safety, and enforcement.

“When New York legalized recreational marijuana, most residents accepted that adults should be free to make their own choices,” said Merante. “What they did not expect was the growing impact public marijuana smoking would have on neighborhoods, parks, business districts, and community gathering places.”

Merante recently encountered a young man smoking marijuana in the lobby of his office building who insisted he had the right to do so because marijuana is legal.

“That experience highlighted a growing problem,” Merante said. “Legalization should not mean a free pass to ignore common-sense rules or basic courtesy.”

Residents throughout Westchester County continue to raise concerns about marijuana smoking near parks, playgrounds, train stations, apartment buildings, and commercial districts.

Merante emphasized that his position is not about reversing legalization.

“The question is not whether marijuana should be legal. The question is whether local communities should have the authority to establish reasonable rules that protect quality of life while respecting individual freedoms,” he said.

Merante is advocating for legislation that would give municipalities broader authority to regulate public marijuana consumption and impose meaningful fines for violations.

“Rules without enforcement are merely suggestions,” Merante said. “Local governments should have the tools they need to protect their communities and hold violators accountable.”

“The goal is not prohibition. The goal is balance,” Merante concluded. “Adults who choose to use marijuana legally should be able to do so. Families should also be able to enjoy public spaces without being exposed to marijuana smoke. As State Senator, I will support legislation that strengthens local control and keeps decisions about our neighborhoods in the hands of local communities, not Albany.”

DA Cacace Announces Arrest of Father in Connection with Disappearance of 12-Year-Old Son from New Rochelle

Westchester County District Attorney Susan Cacace announced today that Dwight C. Richards, father of 12-year-old King Richards, was arrested by New Rochelle police detectives today in connection with the disappearance of his son.

Richards, 54, of New Rochelle, is scheduled to be arraigned in White Plains City Court Wednesday morning on a misdemeanor information charging him with one count of Criminal Contempt in the Second Degree, a class A misdemeanor.

DA Cacace said: "I am relieved beyond measure that, nearly one year later, King Richards was found in good health and was returned to the care of his mother. The defendant's alleged defiance of the Family Court, allegedly concealing his son for the better part of a year, caused his mother and everyone in this county an agonizing wait as the child's whereabouts remained unknown for so long. I want to commend the New Rochelle police for never giving up their search efforts or their hope that King Richards would be located safe and sound. Their diligence led to today's reunion."

"All children in Westchester deserve to live without fear that they will be stolen without warning from the sanctuary of their communities. We must strive for a reality where that is possible."

According to a misdemeanor information filed with the court, on July 18, 2025, the defendant violated a mandate issued by Westchester County Family Court Judge Allison E. Burke by failing to produce his son, King Richards, to the court on that date.

Through the present, the defendant has remained in violation of the court's mandate by failing to produce his son to the court, as required by the mandate, the misdemeanor information alleges.

The case was investigated by the New Rochelle Police Department and the Child Abuse Bureau within the District Attorney's Office. The case is being prosecuted by the Child Abuse Bureau.

or YouTube channels over the past week. The ad highlights the ongoing work of ICE and the separation of immigrant communities, and then claims “while Cait Conley profited by over \$325,000 from firms supporting the apparatus weaponized by ICE. True activists fought ICE’s atrocities, but Conley kept collecting. That’s not progressive, that’s profiteering.”

The ad is paid for by Progressive Champions PAC, which sounds like a democratic leaning group but in reality is a secret republican funded group which is dumping up to \$1 Million in negative ads against Cait Conley in NY-17, according to several published reports and democrats. The question that many want to know if why is a republican funded group putting their dollars in an attempt to make Conley lose the democratic primary on June 23, (and in early voting now)?

“Cait Conley is the one that [Mike Lawler] doesn’t want to see. Just today, a Republican backed Dark Money group put almost \$1 million into an IE to go against her specifically, said Morgan Hook, Blue Jacket Strategies, on Spectrum News.

Due to Federal Election Commission campaign laws, donors can fund Political Action Committee’s without identifying their identity. And that is the case with Progressive Champions PAC.

Progressive Champions PAC is a GOP front, wrote Judd Legum, <https://popular.info/p/progressive-champions-pac-is-a-gop>. A Popular Information investigation, however, reveals that Progressive Champions PAC is tied to the Congressional Leadership Fund (CLF), the super PAC of the House Republican leadership. Progressive Champions PAC is part of a network of sham “progressive” PACs attempting to influence key Democratic primaries across the country.

On its website, Progressive Champions PAC says, “Our mission is simple: elect bold, progressive candidates up and down the ballot who will fight for working families, protect our democracy, and build a future that works for everyone.”

Westchester County Executive Ken Jenkins posted, “Republicans are so desperate to hold onto power that they’re now trying to rig the playing field by meddling in a Democratic primary. It’s a cynical, dishonest tactic that shows just how afraid they are of facing a strong Democratic nominee in November. The voters of the 17th Congressional District won’t be fooled by these political games. Our elections belong to the people—not to Republican strategists in Washington trying to manipulate the outcome for their own benefit.”

Neither Jenkins, nor Westchester Congressman George Latimer have endorsed a democratic candidate in NY-17.

While five democrats are running in the democratic primary in NY-17, most believe the contest is between Conley, and Rockland County Legislator Beth Davidson. Many of us in NY-17 have also seen a TV ad paid for by Davidson’s campaign laying out the same allegations against Conley.

And while no democrat will directly link Progressive Champions PAC to the Davidson campaign, the Conley campaign did say in their release about the meddling that “Responding to a plea from Beth Davidson, a MAGA Dark-Money Super PAC is now spending nearly \$1 million falsely attacking veteran Cait Conley.”

Conley said, “Republican dark money Super PACs are targeting me with false attacks because they know I’m the only candidate who will beat Mike Lawler in November. “Mike Lawler and his MAGA allies are scared, and they should be. As a West Point Grad and Army Special Operations combat veteran, I have spent my entire life serving our country and taking on the hardest fights when the stakes couldn’t be higher. If they think this is going to intimidate me, they have no idea who they are messing with. And Republicans are seriously underestimating NY-17 democrats who will see through their political lies and deceit. I’m ready to bring real leadership to Congress, not more political games.

“I am running to stop the greed, corruption, and chaos caused by this Trump Administration and enabled by cowards in Congress like Mike Lawler. They know I will rein in ICE and demand accountability for the abuses of power we have seen, and they are scared of it. Make no mistake – they will fail here as well. We have the momentum and we will win on June 23rd and take the fight right to Mike Lawler,” said Conley, with the campaign pointing to the following Fact Check.

Cait Conley does not work for or with ICE. Cait Conley does not work for or with Palantir. Cait consults for two technology firms. These companies have nothing to do with immigration enforcement, and neither have contracts with ICE.

However, unique to New York, career political operative and politician Beth Davidson has actually called on these outside groups for support in a desperate attempt to save her flailing campaign, directing them with a redbox message they are now mirroring exactly.

The redbox message states, Last updated: May 20, 2026 “Voters need to see on television that Cait Conley currently works for two AI companies that help Donald Trump’s DHS and ICE track and detain law-abiding immigrants and American citizens. Conley has refused to quit, even after ICE killed two Americans in Minneapolis, expanding her work and earning over \$325k. Meanwhile, Beth Davidson is standing up to Donald Trump and Mike Lawler and protecting Rockland County from ICE’s recklessness.”

Mike Lawler and Beth Davidson are attempting to draw false links between Cait’s work and ICE that do not exist,” end of Conley response.

Both Davidson and Effie Phillips-Staley, another democrat in the NY-17 primary, condemned the attack ads against Conley in statements.

The Lawler campaign, also not directly tied to the ad or the Progressive Champions PAC, has frequently send out campaign emails attacking Conley. Their latest, titled “CAIT CONLEY’S EMPLOYER SELLS AI TO ICE AND TOUTS ITS PALANTIR PARTNERSHIP. WHY IS CAIT CONLEY LYING ABOUT IT?” makes the same arguments that both Progressive Champions PAC and Beth Davison make. So, if we can’t verify where the Progressive Champions PAC \$\$\$\$ came from to pay for the Conley negative ads, can we at least deduce that the Republican Congressional Campaign Committee and Congressman Lawler’s campaign, would prefer to run against Davidson, and not Conley, in November?

DCCC Spokesperson Riya Vashi said, “Desperate D.C. Republicans are so terrified Mike Lawler will lose in November that they’re resorting to meddling in yet another Democratic primary. It’s just the latest sign that Lawler knows he can’t win on his toxic record of rubber-stamping Donald Trump’s extreme agenda of raising costs and gutting health care — and Democrats will make sure NY-17 voters know exactly who’s behind these shameless and frankly pathetic tactics.”

On March 3, 2026, an Order was entered, directing that Plaintiff appear in-person on March 9, 2026 at 9:00 a.m. for oral argument regarding Motion Sequence No. 1.

If counsel or a party is unable to appear on time due to unforeseen circumstances (i.e., delays due to inclement weather or road closures), counsel should contact opposing counsel(s), and advise the Part Clerk or Court's staff, by telephone, as soon as possible. Tardy arrivals will not be tolerated."

Pursuant to the Part Rules of the Hon. James L. Hyer, J.S.C. § (E)(b):

"A request to adjourn a conference must be made in writing, by NYSCEF ONLY, except as provided in Section C(a), at least two (2) full business days in advance of the scheduled conference, unless there is an emergency."

Pursuant to Uniform Rules of the New York State Trial Courts § 202.27:

"At any scheduled call of a calendar or at any conference, if all parties do not appear and proceed or announce their readiness to proceed immediately or subject to the engagement of counsel, the judge may note the default on the record and enter an order as follows:

(a) If the plaintiff appears but the defendant does not, the judge may grant judgment by default or order an inquest.

(b) If the defendant appears but the plaintiff does not, the judge may dismiss the action and may order a severance of counterclaims or cross-claims.

(c) If no party appears, the judge may make such order as appears just."

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS HEREBY:

ORDERED that the Defendant is in default; and it is hereby

ORDERED that an Inquest shall be held on **July 10, 2026, at 10:00 a.m.**, wherein all parties must appear in-person to address all of the issues pending before this Court pertaining to this action, including but not limited to: (1) grounds for dissolution of the parties' marriage; (2) equitable distribution of marital property; (3) declaration of separate property; (4) claims of dissipation; (5) spousal support and maintenance; (6) child custody, access and support; (7) resumption of pre-marriage surnames; (8) attorneys' fees and litigation expense requests; and (9) any other issues arising out of the requested dissolution of the parties' marriage; and it is further

identified as the suspect.

Kropa was subsequently taken into custody in connection with the incident.

Kropa was charged with:

- Public Lewdness – Class B Misdemeanor

Kropa was arraigned in the Town of Patterson Justice Court and released on his own recognizance." end of release.

Since then there has been very little additional information, including a "we can't comment on a personell matter" from the Mahopac School District.

Facebook comments below the Sheriff's release claim that Kropka is a Spanish Teacher at Mahopac High School. One post reprinted an email-letter from the school district.

"Something popped off

Dear Mahopac Community,

We are writing to inform you that we are aware of a recent incident involving one of our employees.

Please be assured that we are currently cooperating fully with local law enforcement as they conduct their investigation and are taking this matter seriously. As this is an active investigation, we are unable to share any personnel details or further specifics at this time.

Our top priority remains the safety, well-being, and trust of our students, parents and community. We are committed to maintaining our operations with the high standards of integrity you expect from us.

Thank you for your understanding and continued support.

Sincerely, Frank Miele, Superintendent of Schools."

A database of salaries for NY State employees lists does show Craig A. Kropa as a teacher in 2023-24.

Another comment said the incident occurred at 130pm in the middle of the day on a Wednesday, a school day.

Kropka's photo appeared on Facebook in a group photo, which we cropped, and confirmed his identity with parents and students at Mahopac High School.

Also unclear is if any disciplinary action has been taken against Kropka, or if he will be suspended or terminated from his position. He was only charged with a misdemeanor, how ever strange and perverse it may be.
