

Ipark Buys Rising Ground-Leake & Watts 28 acre riverfront property for \$52.6 Million

The continued interest in Yonkers by developers and corporate America continues, with the announcement that iPark has purchased the 32-acre property in the Ludlow neighborhood of southwest Yonkers, formerly occupied by Leake & Watts, now Rising Ground.

Published reports state that the sale price was \$52.6 million The property will be used as a film studio and a performing arts school for the Yonkers Public

iPark and its parent company, National Resources, have developed a 14.4 acre property in the downtown by the Yonkers train station to be used by Great Point Studios and Lionsgate Entertainment as the Hudson Film & Television Center.

The Hudson riverfront property was one of the largest parcels that was closest to New York City, for sale. For more than 100 years, the property served as a social service agency center for children under foster care and young adults with advanced developmental disabilities.

Many of the 25 buildings were used as cottages for many of the youth who lived there for a short period of time. Leake & Watts changed its name to Rising Ground in 2018. Rising Ground sold the property to strengthen its financial outlook, and it continues to serve the pubic at 55 sites in Westchester and New York City, serving 25,000 individuals with 1,600 employees.

The tree lines property includes ballfields and sits on a rise, giving the prop-

First Legal Marijuana Sale in NY, But Court Case Holds Up Yonkers Marijuana Stores



NYC Council Member Carlina Rivera Celebrates the Opening of the First Cannabis Dispensary in Manhattan

The first, legal, non-medical marijuana dispensary will open in lower Manhattan today, Dec. 29. Housing Works Cannabis Co., located at 750 Broadway, near Astor Place and Washington Square Park, will be selling marijuana products starting at 4:20pm today, and daily from 11am-7pm. Cash payments only are accepted for the time being. Housing Works is a non-profit that assists persons involved in the criminal justice system.

The opening validates Governor Kathy Hochul's promise that New York will start selling, and taxing, marijuana by the end of the year. Other marijuana stores and cafes will open in early 2023.

Last month, the NYS Office of Cannabis Management awarded 36 licenses, to 28 Justice-involved individuals & 8 Nonprofit organizations, to sell marijuana grown in New York State, at 223 farms.

OCM Director Chris Alexander said, "Not only have we ended the prohibition in New York, but we're showing the nation, and the world, how to build a market that's truly equitable and inclusive, and works to undo the harms caused

City of Yonkers Breaks Ground on Trevor Park Renovations

Department of Parks, Recreation & Conservation Commences First of Three Phases of Park Improvements

On Jan. 3, Yonkers Mayor Mike Spano along with the Yonkers Department of Parks, Recreation & Conservation broke ground on the first of three phases of renovations planned for Trevor Park, located on Ravine Avenue.

Renovations for the 25-acre park include the installation of new basketball courts, new tennis courts, new benches and walkways and the replacement of the playground surfacing. The first phase, estimated at \$1.1 million, is scheduled to be complete in early summer.

"Trevor Park is a staple of this neighborhood and our waterfront," said Mayor Spano. "When we invest in local parks like Trevor, we are investing in the quality of life of our residents. Thank you to our City Council, especially Councilmember Shanae Williams and our Parks Department for prioritizing these improvements for the betterment of our City."

Shanae Williams, Yonkers City Council, 1st District, said, "Trevor Park is a

significant community space here in west Yonkers, yet for years it has been overlooked and in dire need of an upgrade. I'm proud that together with the Mayor, Parks Commissioner and the Trevor Park Committee members, we are at the stage of renovating this magnificent park for the community."

by the disproportionate enforcement of cannabis prohibition. Every dollar spent in this growing industry will help support independent businesses, our schools, and our communities."

OCM received more than 900 applications for licenses to sell, and plans on approving 150 in 2023. NY State issued 37 recreational cannabis licenses, 13 in New York City and 3 in the Bronx, closest to Westchester.

No licenses were awarded to applicants from Westchester, Putnam or Rockland Counties, because of a lawsuit filed by a company outside of New York State. The lawsuit claims that round one of the licensing process, which grants licenses to applicants from NY only, is unconstitutional.

Variscite NY One, Inc. filed the lawsuit and applied for OCM licenses in the mid-hudson region which includes Westchester, Brooklyn and other upstate locations. A federal judge has issued a restraining order barring OCM from granting licenses in those communities.

OCM has filed an appeal to the restraining order, which affects more than 50 licenses to sell marijuana. As a result of the lawsuit, OCM did not announce the recipients of licenses in Westchester or Putnam when they announced the 36 other licenses last month.

But several Westchester communities have already opted out of allowing marijuana stores or cafes to open in their communities. According to the Rockefeller tracker, 23 Westchester local governments have opted out. They are:

Ardsley, Bronxville, Eastchester, Elmsford, Irvington, Larchmont, Lewisboro, Mamaroneck Town, Mamaroneck Village, Mount Kisco, Mount Pleasant, New Castle, North Castle, North Salem, Pelham Manor, Pleasantville, Port Chester, Rye City, Rye Brook, Somers, Tuckahoe, Yorktown and Harrison.

And according to the tracker, the Westchester cities of Mount Vernon, New Rochelle, White Plains, Yonkers and the Town of Pound Ridge and the Village of Sleepy Hollow will permit both cafes and dispensiaries. The Town of Greenburgh will allow stores but not cafes.

So when and if the lawsuit is resolved, the only place in Westchester where stores and cafes can open will be in the seven communities listed above, and we will report on that when it happens.

Yonkers Rising and Yonkerstimes.com recently spoke to Dr. Janusz Rudnicki, Gynecological Surgeon and OBGYN at St. John's Riverside Hospital, about the latest advances in gynecological robotic surgery, and specifically the minimally Invasive da Vinci® Gynecologic Surgery.

Dr. Rudnicki is a physician who brings more than 40 years of experience to his patients, and it shows in the compassion he brings to each consultation, diagnosis, and surgery if required. But Dr. Rudnicki also brings a passion for keeping up to date with the latest technological advances and sharing them with his patients.

"I take great joy and pride in providing compassionate and highly skilled care for generations of women. If you love what you do, you aren't working a day in your life, and at St. John's Riverside Hospital, it is the nurses and staff that make it like a family. A hysterectomy removes the uterus and possibly the ovaries and fallopian tubes. Several conditions may prompt your doctor to recommend a hysterectomy. They range from benign (noncancerous) conditions to cancer conditions, including uterine cancer. Approximately 400,000 women in the U.S. still receive hysterectomies each year.

Dr. Rudnicki explained that there are four ways to perform a hysterectomy on women: Open surgery, through a long incision through the abdomen; trans vaginal surgery, laparoscopic surgery, also known as keyhole or band-aid surgery, where minor cuts are made in the tummy; or robotic surgery, which is the most advanced and sophisticated.

"For 20 years, we did laparoscopic hysterectomy, so robotics is the next step in performing minimally invasive surgery. I think it's the future of medicine, and I'm excited because robotic surgery is a significant extension of performing surgery with less pain and scarring. There is also a faster recovery, reduced risk of infection, and patients stay in the hospital for a shorter amount of time," said Dr. Rudnicki.

Robotic surgery involves mounting tiny instruments on robotic arms to maximize the range of motion while using small, lighted cameras, which allows the doctor to view the surgery from a computer monitor. The da Vinci surgical systems integrate robotics and sophisticated computer technology with the skills of Dr. Rudnicki

"At St. John's Riverside Hospital, we are operating on the da Vinci 4, the most advanced model. Safety is paramount, and Intuitive Surgical, the company that makes the da Vinci robot, has set standards ensuring that all surgeons at our hospital are trained and updated," said Dr. Rudnicki.

The da Vinci system allows surgeons to see and move in three dimensions, allowing them to perform delicate operations with precision and only tiny surgical openings. "Everybody who needs gynecological surgery could be considered a candidate for robotic surgery. I tell all my patients that the lighting and the instrumentation are more precise and state of the art."



Sen. Mayer "Disappointed" That Gov. Hochul Vetoed 4 of Her Bills

Westchester State Senator Shelley Mayer issued the following statement after Governor Kathy Hochul vetoed four of her sponsored bills.

"On the eve of Christmas Eve, I'm extremely disappointed that Governor Hochul chose to veto four of my legislative bills-proposals that addressed specific problems my constituents have faced. With my colleagues, I worked hard on these bills for months, always with an open door to those who raised concerns about them. Frequently, I modified the bills to reflect their concerns.

"Ultimately, these four bills made it through the Committee process in both the Senate and Assembly, passed on the filor, in some cases unanimously, and then were summarily vetoed on the last possible day."

"One bill for example, S.6828-would have required the Department of Labor to notify applicants for Unemployment Insurance whether their claim was approved or denied in 30 days-like most other government benefits. During CO-VID, hundreds of constituents came to my office for help, and knowing the poor experiences my constituents were having, I was determined to find a better way for them to find out information about their claims on a timely basis.'

"This bill was a common sense solution to a problem, one that is premised on the belief that the agencies of New York State work for you, the people, not the other way around. Without this legislation, claimants will continue to be left in indefinite limbo, unsure of their status, and unable to appeal DOL's decision. The bill passed the Senate unanimously."

'Another of my bills, S.9432, would simply require the MTA to develop a vegetation management policy, to protect green space, and require notice to neighbors and elected leaders when land modifications are made. As a good neighbor, the MTA should voluntarily support this effort, but we needed a law to get it done. Sadly, my legislaton to require this was vetoed as well."

"I believe the agencies of state government are here to serve the taxpayers and the residents. If I find they are not serving New Yorkers, it is my job as a State Senator to make them do so."

"I'm disappointed in these vetoes, but I'm not going to stop doing what I was elected to do-to fight for my constituents and all New Yorkers," said Senator Mayer.

Gail married Richard Baxter and they had two children: Patrick and Matthew. Gail, Patrick, and Matthew moved to Yonkers, New York around 1976.

In 1988, Gail brought her grandson, Jordan Bazemore, home from the hospital. They have always enjoyed a mother/son relationship. Jordan was a tremendous support to Gail during these past few challenging years. He graduated from Saunders HS and has been employed by the YPS for 15 years.

Shortly after moving to Yonkers, Gail went to work for the Bank of Tokyo Trust Company and later worked for Nynex Telephone Company. Gail also worked as a Parent Coordinator with the Yonkers Public Schools before retiring.

Gail Baxter was a Civil and Social Rights Advocate for 5 decades. She was well known for her passion, courage, and activism. Her legal knowledge and years of experience with navigating school systems helped countless families receive the services they needed. Gail served as President of the Exceptional Child PTA (SEPTA), Chairperson of Mayor Spano's African American Advisory Board, a member of the City Council President's African American Advisory Board, the Aquehung Democratic Women's Club and Gail was a long standing and active member of the Yonkers Branch of NAACP, becoming the Yonkers Branch President from 2008-2010.

Gail was a member of numerous boards, commissions and community-based organizations in Yonkers and Westchester County. Gail's volunteer commitments are too numerous to list them all. On This Day in Yonkers History ...



First African-American Moder Dancer Hemsley Winfield

Monday, January 9th

January 9, 1934: As part of his efforts to comply with Mayor Loehr's orders to drastically reduce city spending, DPW Commissioner Edward Murray announced \$75,000 would be cut from Yonkers street lighting budget. His plan was to reduce lighting in the "heart of Yonkers," and stagger illumination in the outlying sections. Each light in our business sections had two lamps; only one would be lit. E. P. Prezzano, Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company VP, announced his company would be happy to work with Yonkers during the economy move. Murray's total departmental reduction was \$169,697; much of the cost reduction was to come from the elimination of jobs, both labor and higher salaried positions. All savings was earmarked to pay off Yonkers existing debt.

January 9, 1945: People in Yonkers thought they might be seeing a mirage... not once, but twice! Several people called YPD to report they had seen a dog floating down the river on an ice floe! A few hours later, YPD began fielding calls a deer had been spotted floating down the river. In both cases, the Coast Guard in Yonkers made heroic rescues. They picked up the first, indeed a dog, in one of their boats. The same afternoon, they attempted to get the deer on board, but failed. They then used their cutter to push the ice the deer was stranded on towards the shore. As soon as the deer spotted shore, it jumped off the floe, swam to land and galloped away.

Tuesday, January 10th

January 10, 1933: After multiple reports of ghosts prowling around St. John's Cemetery and vandalism of cemetery vaults, Patrolman Albert Will nabbed a New Main Street man in the Odell-Brevoort family mausoleum at the stroke of midnight! While walking through the cemetery, Will saw the heavy door of the vault swing open; the officer entered the vault with his gun drawn and found twenty-two year old Joseph Porter hiding in the corner, surrounded by the 22 family members buried there. Porter refused to reveal why he was there, but insisted he had not disturbed or stolen anything. Judge Boots remanded him without bail for investigation of the malicious mischief charge.

Wednesday, January 11th

January 11, 1945: Lieutenant Edward O'Connor went on trial before Deputy Public Safety Commissioner Frank Duffy. O'Connor, the first of five police officers accused of dereliction, was accused of four violations of police rules. Charges were filed in November by former City Manager William Walsh in connection with an incident centering on alleged major gambling operations. O'Connor, on desk duty at the First Precinct, was charged with failing to record phone calls, failing to record he alleged orders to officers, and reporting to Walsh "contrary to the facts." Prosecuting attorney was Corporation Counsel Broderick; Defense attorney for all officers was former Corporation Counsel Paul Bleakley.

Bleakley attempted to have a joint hearing for all five defendants, but was turned down by the Trial Commissioner. Two witnesses were called, Fred Stoekel and YPD Captain John McCormack, Traffic Division Commander. Stoekel, Manager of the Yonkers Electric Light and Power Company, testified on lighting services for the Sure-Way Developing Shop at 289 Nepperhan Avenue near Copcutt Lane. Mc-Cormack spoke about heavily curtained windows and a lack of laboratory and dark room equipment; the building should have had both according to its leasing agree-

Thursday, January 12th

January 12, 1945: "Famous Handwriting Expert" Elbridge Stein testified at Lieutenant Edward O'Connor's trial; after his "scientific examination" of the police records for the Coputt Lane gambling incident, he stated erasures had been made in the O'Connor report and new notes made. Former City Manager William Walsh stated he went to Police Headquarters after the incident and demanded to see the records. Chief Kruppenbacher showed him records; Walsh then seized possession and kept them until the trial. "Most significant" was testimony of lineman John Scanlon, who attested he saw Patrolman Connolly in Copcutt Lane the morning of the incident. Defense Attorney Bleakley jumped to his feet and thundered, accusing Scanlon of lying; Bleakley stated Scanlon told him in pretrial questioning he was unsure he had seen a patrolman the morning in question.

Friday, January 13th


January 13, 1938: The extreme level of "Dutch Schultz" Flegenheimer's machinations to hide ownership of a Yonkers brewery were revealed in a lawsuit brought by his widow Frances. She believed Schultz' former associates had conspired to give Democratic leader Thomas Brogan ownership of the Yonkers operation, so she filed suit to recover stock in the two dummy companies Schultz set up to hide his ownership. Besides Brogan, among the eleven she named in the suit was her late husband's bodyguard, his lawyer, "lieutenant," and a night club owner. Schultz was believed to be the kingpin of New York bootleggers at the height of Prohibition.

Saturday, January 14th

January 14, 1944: Speaking at the Yonkers Rotary Club, Sidney Karlton, Medical Director of the Pyridium Corporation in Nepera Park, informed members the Yonkers plant was one of the few companies in the US producing the wonder drug Penicillin! This miracle drug, however, was reserved for war use as it was difficult to produce. He also spoke about sulfadiazine, developed "right here in Yonkers at the Nepera Park plant. Sulfadiazine, used to combat strep-throat, pneumonia and gonorrhea, had faced opposition from doctors just ten years earlier. War casualties had sharply dropped as each soldier had packets containing sulfa tablets and powder. Pyridium moved to Yonkers in 1927, just two years after the company was started.

Sunday, January 15th

January 15, 1934: Death claimed Yonkers resident, dance pioneer and founder of the Negro Art Theater Hemsley Winfield who died of pneumonia at New York Hospital at the age of 26. Winfield danced his way to fame as the original witch doctor in Eugene O'Neill's "Emperor Jones," mounted by the Metropolitan Opera Company, the first African-American performing in a credited part at the Met. Winperform in the production. The Yonkers native lived with his family on Wolf Street, and graduated from School Thirteen where he was president of his class.



Families & Children Enjoy Kirk Cameron Read Chidren's Christian Book at Scarsdale Library

Every Westchester resident should support the First Amendment rights of its citizens to host a Drag Queen Story time, but also the right of a Christian Author to read his children's book, both at a Public Library.

In both cases, only those interested in hearing either story can attend. And if you don't like it, or don't want to participate, you can "turn the channel" and don't show up.

According to Scarsdale Police, 700 families, and some protestors, showed up at the Scarsdale Library on Dec. 30 to hear actor and author Kirk Cameron read from his Christian children's book 'As You Grow'.

The Scott Room at the library holds 170, and Cameron read his book to two groups of families. Everyone who listened to Cameron's reading understood that his book, "teaches kids biblical wisdom, through the seasons of life and how to grow the fruits of the Spirit, which are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control," as Cameron explained.

But the response from most of the media, and several protestors has been against Cameron and those who came out to hear about his book and his message. First, based on the attendance, there was strong interest.

Second, according to the SPD, there was no incidents of criminal behavior, and the event went off without a hitch. Cameron wanted to pay for extra time to read to more families who were lined up inside and outside but wasn't able to make it happen.

Westchester resident Robin Stettnisch covered Cameron's event for our newspaper, and like us, was surprised at the negativity in the coverage by some in the local media, notably, Scarsdale 10583. The title of 10583 coverage of Cameron was "Library Overtaken by 700 Visitors to Kirk Cameron's Story Hour," but most librarians would be overjoyed if 700 people attended one of their programs.

The story continues with "Cameron and his book publisher, Brave Books, exploited free speech laws to hold his event at Scarsdale Library." There is no exploitation in exercising your First Amendment rights as an American. A journalist should respect this right more than others, and Cameron was given the same First Amendment protection to hold his event at the same location as Drag Queen Storytime.

One social media post from the 10583-story included, "As far as "exploit[ing] free speech laws to hold his event at Scarsdale Library," these laws exist to protect the speech of those the majority find controversial and even objectionable (yes, even Kirk Cameron's). And it appears they worked as intended here, with "no incidents reported."

10583 continues with "The library was quickly overwhelmed as only 170 people could fit into the Scott Room." The author's use of the term "overwhelmed" indicates a negative connotation that attendees were "invading" the Scarsdale Library. The library, its staff, and the Scarsdale police understood Cameron's event could result in large attendance. They were prepared, and the crowd was peaceful and respectful.

And perhaps the most disturbing part of the 10583 story was, "Though no one knows where all the people came from, there seemed to be few Scarsdale residents in the crowd." As Stettnisch points out, "OK how did they make that determination? By how the people looked? What cars they drove? Seems awfully judgmental and condescending to me."

Stettnisch's characterization that any Scarsdale resident who opposed Cameron's program because attendees lived outside Scarsdale are judgmental and condescending is putting it lightly. In fact, ANY resident of Westchester County can attend ANY program at ANY Westchester library. If the residents and taxpayers of Scarsdale wish to restrict "outsiders" from attending programs at their library, they should lose the state funding that comes for libraries.

10583 also reported that SPD "said that there were 2 readings in the allotted timeframe and 170 were in each reading. There were no incidents reported. Six Scarsdale officers were supported by six County officers for traffic and crowd control. The event concluded on schedule."

Scarsdale 10583 article states, "only one session (storytime) was planned but the library permitted 2 to accommodate more visitors". Stettnisch clarifies, "that was within the hour that was booked and paid for, so they "permitted" nothing. And no mention of how Cameron offered to pay to stay extra and was refused, despite the room being available and the library not closing for another 2 hours."

Another odd piece to the 10583 story was ""though billed as a story hour for young children, the visitors included grandparents, parents, teens, and toddlers," as if to indicate that for family members to join young children in a book reading was strange.

A post below the story reads, "Also, LOL at "though billed as a story hour for young children, the visitors included grandparents, parents, teens and toddlers." Yes, that's generally how all children's events go, as young kids generally cannot drive themselves to a library."

And from Stettinsch, "So... what's so horrible about a family story time? They didn't seem to mind the toddlers that were there with family at the Drag Queen storytime sponsored by and promoted by the library for children as young as 2."

The 10583 story concludes with a quote from Mark Gompertz, Group Editorial Director at Skyhorse Publishing and a Scarsdale resident. "While I'm not sure how I feel about all the "outsiders" coming into the community, I applaud the village/ library for allowing it just as I would a story hour about a drag Queen even if alt right groups didn't feel it was appropriate. Crazy world."

But isn't diversity and inclusion supposed to be all about "outsiders"?

"I would note that Scarsdale Library hosted a LGBT Drag Queen story hour this past June (2022). But families showing up to hear a story about love, patience, kindness, oh no!" said Stettinsch, who reminds us that the drag queen storytime was arranged for, sponsored and promoted by Scarsdale Library for ages 2 + to "inspire a love of reading while teaching deeper lessons on diversity, self-love, and an appreciation of others," but they refused to sponsor or promote a storytime dealing with values such as love, patience, kindness etc which should not only be "Christian" but "Universal".

Cameron said after the event, "Thank you to my brothers and sisters in the Family of Faith and all who showed up in Indy and Scarsdale, NY to celebrate faith, hope and love and protect the hearts and minds of our children...One of the aspects that has always made this country great is the free expression of ideas essential to an informed citizenry."

In the final analysis, the Scarsdale Library did the right thing by allowing

Cameron to read from his book.

The man allegedly sneaks past security on campus and into the art gallery in the early morning hours. Some have questioned why the art gallery cannot be locked, or at least have a feature where a college ID is required for entry.

Others wonder why this matter has not been made more public. Perhaps it was because officials at SUNY Purchase did not want the negative publicity, or were hoping to make an arrest.

erty unparalleled views of the Hudson River, with the metro-north railroad running next door. The property was listed in Feb. 2021 for \$60 million.

In August of this year, Yonkers Mayor Mike Spano and the Yonkers Board of Education today announced the Board's approval to sign a 20-year lease with iPark Riverdale, LLC., to rent the Frank T. Biondi and the Ames School Buildings at the former Rising Ground property on Hawthorne Street. In partnership with Great Point Studios, owner and operator of the new Lionsgate Studio Yonkers, the 100,000 square foot property will be the future home to Yonkers Public Schools' new media and production magnet school.

can and a proud union member, my vetting may have taken longer because some wanted to make sure that I was who I said I was.

Did anyone in the Queens GOP, or Nassau GOP, or in the NYGOP, investigate George Santos like they looked into my past? Obviously not.

And the leaders in the NYGOP had two years to vet Santos, because he ran in 2020, losing to Tom Suozzi.


