Anthony Nicodemo Makes His Case for County Legislator

Why are you running for Westchester County Legislator in D-15?

City Council Unanimously Passes Budget, Reduces Tax Increase to 4.75 %

Only 18 Speakers Show up to Saunders Hearing

Following weeks of budget hearings, the Yonkers City Council unanimously adopted the City of Yonkers FY2026-2027 Budget. The \$1.64 billion Adopted Budget invests in quality-of-life services, public safety, infrastructure, and education, while preserving all active municipal services and the municipal workforce.

The FY2026-2027 Adopted Budget provides \$56.3 million in additional support for Yonkers Public Schools, freeing up critical resources for classroom instruction and student support. This funding includes \$17.3 million to improve school infrastructure and expand Wi-Fi connectivity, and \$6.3 million for textbooks, laptops, and educational equipment, while freeing up additional resources for classroom instruction and student services.

"Most importantly, we are making a historic investment in Yonkers Public Schools, supporting our students, strengthening our classrooms, and preparing our schools for the future," said Mayor Mike Spano. "This budget reflects our commitment to protecting taxpayers while continuing to invest in the services residents rely on every day."

The Adopted Budget reduces the proposed 5.25% tax rate increase to 4.75 percent. The budget also includes appropriations to settle uniform union contracts.

Mayor Spano added, "I want to thank Governor Kathy Hochul, Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins, and our state delegation for recognizing the needs of our City."

Between the additional school aid and the State's increased AIM funding, this support will allow us to continue making meaningful investments in education without sacrificing essential city services."

As part of the State's enhanced Temporary Municipal Assistance funding, Yonkers will receive the maximum \$15 million allocation from New York

As Other Malls Across the Country Struggle, Cross County Center in Yonkers Expanding

Yonkers Mayor Mike Spano recently joined executives from Marx Realty (MNPP), community leaders, and elected officials to celebrate the groundbreaking of two new retail buildings that will anchor the next phase of redevelopment at the iconic Cross County Center.

The 58,000-square foot expansion project includes the construction of a 14,000-square-foot retail building and a two-story, 44,000-square-foot flagship retail building on the center’s north lot, along with underground parking and a dramatic new 4-acre park designed to enhance customer and community experience.

The new buildings represent one of the most significant additions to Cross County Center in decades and mark the first major ground-up retail expansions at the property since the addition of restaurant buildings in 2015 and Target redevelopment in 2023.

Yonkers Mayor Mike Spano said, “Today’s groundbreaking marks another exciting chapter for Cross County Center and for the City of Yonkers. The expansion at this iconic shopping destination represents continued investment in our community, creates new jobs, strengthens our local economy, and enhances the experience for residents and visitors alike. We are proud to support thoughtful development that keeps Yonkers thriving and reinforces Cross County Center’s role as a premier regional destination for shopping, dining, and entertainment.”

The larger two-story building is planned to accommodate a national apparel retailer’s super flagship location, while the additional retail building will create opportunities for new tenants and experiences at the center. The project will also include a new park of lush landscaping, a boardwalk, seating areas, vertical transportation access, pedestrian enhancements, and improved walkability throughout the north lot redevelopment area.

“We are excited to officially break ground on a project that reflects the continued evolution of Cross County Center,” said Craig Deitelzweig, CEO of Marx Realty. “These new buildings will help us meet the incredible demand from retailers looking to be part of Cross County Center while creating an even more engaging and community-oriented environment for our visitors with a beautiful new 4-acre park.”

In addition to the new retail buildings, the redevelopment will introduce a dramatic 4-acre park and boardwalk experience featuring an allée of trees, café-style seating, gathering areas, and flexible programming space for seasonal events, farmers markets, wellness programming, and Summer Fest activities. The green space is envisioned as the new “front door” to the center.

Marx Realty is working with GTL Construction, TPG Architecture as architect of record and Dirtworks Landscape Architecture on the design of the new park and landscaped public spaces that will anchor the redevelopment project.

First opened in 1954 as the nation’s first open-air shopping center, Cross County Center today welcomes approximately 14 million visitors annually and is home to more than 100 retail, dining, entertainment, and educational tenants. Recent additions and investments throughout the property continue to reinforce its role as one of the Northeast’s most successful lifestyle centers.

Located at the intersection of the Cross County Parkway and I-87, the 1.15 million-square-foot center remains a major economic engine for Yonkers and Westchester County.

Gov. Hochul Safeguards NY’s Roads by Stopping New York City’s Super Speeders Through Intelligent Speed Assistance



Governor Kathy Hochul today signed legislation as part of the FY27 Enacted Budget to strengthen public safety across New York.

Governor Hochul’s FY27 Enacted Budget continues investments to support effective policing, combat crime, and ensure justice for victims and survivors. This year’s budget will help New York achieve these goals by:

Establishing a new Crime Analysis Center in Westchester County to complete statewide coverage of New York’s Crime Analysis Center Network. This center will provide local and regional law enforcement with real-time crime analysis, investigative support, and stronger information sharing with counties and State partners.

Authorization for New York City to establish a pilot program requiring the installation of Intelligent Speed Assistance devices in the vehicles of so-called “super speeders” – drivers with a documented pattern of flouting speeding laws and putting New Yorkers at risk. The pilot will directly target this dangerous driving behavior by preventing these drivers from driving over the posted speed limit, helping to avert tragedies before they happen and making city streets safer for everyone. Based on the results from this pilot initiative, New York will explore allowing other interested communities around the state to opt into an Intelligent Speed Assistance program.

The “Stop Super Speeders” law, officially signed by Governor Kathy Hochul, mandates the installation of speed-limiting devices (Intelligent Speed Assistance) in the vehicles of habitual, repeat speeders. The Legislation Details: The Threshold: Drivers who accumulate 16 or more speed camera violations in a single 12-month period are classified as “super speeders”. Mandatory Device: Affected drivers are required to install speed restrictors in their vehicles, which interface with GPS to physically prevent the car from exceeding the posted speed limit. Timeline & Penalties: Once notified, drivers have 45 days to install the technology and must keep it in the vehicle for at least 12 months. Failure to comply will result in the loss of their vehicle registration. Rollout: The legislation first targets New York City as a pilot program, with options for other municipalities across New York State to opt-in in the future. Yonkers, and Westchester, should consider opting in to this program.

Happy the Elephant, Farewell, My Friend

Letter to the Editor:

I want to first acknowledge that the Wildlife Conservation Society (WCS) as a global organization does great work in the field of conservation and routinely assists with the rescue and rehabilitation of trafficked animals. However, WCS needs to step up and actually “stand for wildlife” by not allowing animals to be kept in captivity for human amusement.

The death of Happy the Asian Elephant is deeply saddening, not only for the loss of a magnificent elephant whose life was anything but happy, but for the disappointing response by the Bronx Zoo’s interim president. The lawsuits brought in defense of Happy’s rights as a self-aware individual are NOT frivolous. Zoo management should welcome the opportunity to be anew by releasing Patty, now the lone elephant confined at the zoo, to an accredited elephant sanctuary. Additionally, the standard established by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) does not permit a lone female elephant to be held in captivity.

The rationalization that animals like Happy and Patty are ambassadors for their species is a pipedream at best. Zoos are an antiquated relic, and visitors are more entertained by animatronic dinosaurs than living, breathing, thinking animals that deserve better.

Keeping Up With Cienna Rose This Pride Month

Five years ago, when I first interviewed Cienna [Rosalina] Rose with Yonkers Times, she was a 21-year-old trans advocate from Yonkers, determined to use her voice to educate folx and create change. At the time, she told me she wanted to be famous. More importantly, she wanted to be heard. She ended up on Yonkers Voice after her feature.

Today, at 25, the woman many know as Cienna Rose is continuing to build a platform rooted in storytelling, advocacy, faith, and self-discovery.

A Yonkers native and graduate of New Rochelle High School, Rose now lives in Tampa, Florida, where she says she feels most at home. Like many Yonkers residents, she has traveled back and forth between New York and Florida. While her social media presence has continued to grow, she believes some of the most important developments in her life have happened away from the spotlight.

Over the past year, Rose has worked on several projects aimed at challenging misconceptions about trans folx. Among them is an upcoming collaboration with a major recording studio in Atlanta. Although confidentiality agreements prevent her from naming the company or project, she said the content focuses on breaking down stereotypes and sharing authentic stories from members of the trans community.

“It focuses on what real stories from trans people look like,” Rose said.

Her advocacy has also expanded beyond issues directly affecting trans folx.

Last year, she partnered with Free & Just and traveled to Atlanta to help cover stories about how abortion laws in certain states have impacted women’s lives. The experience, she said, reinforced the importance of supporting all women.

“It showed me that beyond being trans, I can stand on women’s rights—all women’s rights,” she said. “I don’t have to limit myself to only talking about trans rights.”

Away from advocacy work, Rose says she has deepened her relationship with God. She described learning to trust the process, even when she does not fully understand where life is leading her.

“I’ve become comfortable not always understanding what God is doing in my life,” she said. “I just trust that I’m highly favored and that things will work in my favor.”

That renewed confidence has inspired her to pursue another longtime passion: music. Rose recently began recording in professional studios and hopes to release her first music project later this year.

“I’ve always had a natural talent for music,” she said. “Getting into the studio and developing that talent has been exciting.”

Rose also recently returned to Tampa after spending time elsewhere. She said the city’s vibrant LGBTQ+ community, supportive friendships, and opportunities for content creation made it clear where she belonged.

In recent months, she has expanded her YouTube presence, posting storytime videos that generated more than 300,000 views in just three months.

Still, she says her greatest accomplishment has been learning to love herself more fully. She credits positive affirmations, self-reflection, and personal growth with helping her overcome self-doubt and embrace her potential.

Back in 2021, Rose ended our interview with a prediction: she was going to be famous.

Five years later, her confidence is the same. Only now, it feels like less of a dream and more like a woman steadily becoming exactly who she always believed she could be.

When the Preliminary Articles of Peace were signed in November of 1782, they included a clause – inserted by the American delegation – that prevented the British from carrying off any property – “including negroes” – as they evacuated from the colonies. oritizes people’s needs.

Flooding remains a serious issue throughout this district, with many communities impacted several times each year. Under County Executives George Latimer and Ken Jenkins, Westchester has made critical investments in flood mitigation infrastructure, and that commitment must continue. Residents deserve leadership that takes these challenges seriously and plans for the future.

Infrastructure is another area where county government can directly impact the quality of life. Yonkers History, continued from pg 3-

June 10, 1945: Yonkers Red Cross Chair Marian Jacobs reported local hospitals realized “military needs came first even though civilian nurses and hospitals were greatly overworked.”

Our Red Cross facilitated 92 Yonkers nurses entering military service; they “willingly responded to the military requests.”

Once military’s needs for nurses were met, our chapter turned its efforts to staffing local hospitals. Jacobs put out a call as “hospitals were in desperate need of nurses... every nurse who can give even a little time” was asked to contact the Red Cross.

Thursday, June 11th

June 11, 1907: The German Odd Fellows paid \$41,000 for the Tuckahoe Road farm of Yonkers’ first Mayor James Courter; he died a few months earlier. They planned to create a residence for their aged members.

June 11, 1936: Yonkers’ campaign against shorts became serious; police officers posted signs around the Ninth Ward warning visitors to obey “General City ordinance No. 7 1935.” It made it illegal for anyone over 16 to appear in public “in scanty attire” or face a \$150 fine, three days in jail, or both.

Friday, June 12th

June 12, 1693: The Royal Charter creating the Manor of Philipsborough (Philipseburg) was granted to Frederick Philipse by King William III and Queen Mary II.

Philipse became the first Lord of the Manor!

June 12, 1940: Because of an inability to find additional room, a two-shift schedule at Saunders Trades School became imminent. Yonkers Advisory Board for Vocational and Extension Education recommended shifts as the last resort.

The Board of Ed hoped WPA labor would revamp the Elks Building for the Administrative offices occupying School Ten.

Saunders either could tell new students they couldn’t come because there was no room, or the school would open from 8 am to 5:45 pm with two shifts.

Saturday, June 13th

June 13, 1935: Ninth Ward Alderman William Slater announced he would take movies of “scantily attired Sunday paraders” along the Aqueduct to rid his district of these strollers from outside Yonkers.

June 13, 1943: Maria Ewing, Ohio Senator Thomas Ewing’s granddaughter, presented a replica of a bust of the late Mr. Ewing to Ohio University; the original created by French sculptor Jean-Antoine Houdin still graced the son’s Palisade Avenue home.

Ewing had worked in salt mines to pay his college tuition. Not just the first graduate of Ohio University, he was the first person to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in the Northwest Territory. The college’s Ewing Hall was named after him.

He was the fourteenth Secretary of the Treasury and the first Secretary of the Interior. Ewing took in a boy who later became Civil War General William Tecumseh Sherman!

June 13, 1945: After the 1944 edition was canceled because of the paper shortage, the 1945 Saunders yearbook “Technicraft” was the largest ever because it included the Class of 1944 who sacrificed their yearbook for the war effort. Dedicated to Machine Shop Teacher John Hodgart, it also was a memorial to late Saunders PE teacher Captain Gustave Laffel, the first Yonkers teacher killed in action.

Sunday, June 14th

June 14, 1917: Sherwood Park Public School boys vowed to donate proceeds of their work to the Yonkers Chapter of the Red Cross; Manual Training Teacher Mr. Cheney presented their first installment of \$29 to the Yonkers Red Cross representative.

June 14, 1920: South Yonkers Development Company broke ground for a row of one-family homes on Van Cortlandt Park Avenue opposite Loudoun Street. Albert Lockwood headed the company.

June 14, 1942: Although the defense training schools had eight new lathes and many other pieces of equipment, no one could use them. Why? The Board of Education didn’t have the money to install them!
